

### What is labor market information and why should a business use it?

Labor market information (LMI) includes data about employment levels, unemployment rates, wages & earnings, employment projections, jobs, training resources and careers. It can help you recruit qualified workers, develop job descriptions, obtain affirmative action data, learn about wages in your area and make sound economic decisions.

### **Labor Market Review**

The monthly Labor Market Review includes current and historical data on employment by industry; hours and earnings for Ohio and twelve metropolitan areas; civilian labor force estimates of employment and unemployment; and selected unemployment compensation data. Seasonally adjusted estimates are included for Ohio. http://OhioLMl.com/ces/lmr.pdf

### **Leading Indicators**
